The natural reserve’s main conservation project concerns the griffon vulture (Gyps fulvus) who has been successfully reintroduced in the reserve.</i></p> <p><i>The Griffon conservation project started in the late 80s in the Friulian pre-Alps. It seeks to stem the decline of vulture population in the Alps and the Adriatic area by providing food and supporting the establishment of new colonies. In order to attain this goal a feeding point was created and 75 griffons were released. Currently the colony has about 150 griffons in winter and over 200 in spring and summer, when individuals arrive from Croatia, France, Spain, Bulgaria, Serbia, etc. About 30 pairs nest along the central section of the valley of the River Tagliamento.</i></p>
