The MSc degree program in Forest Science is held at the School of Agriculture and Veterinary Medicine that is located in [Agripolis Campus](#) in Legnaro, around 10 km far from Padova downtown.

Entry requirements

Domestic scholars

A successful applicant must hold specific curricular requirements, skills and abilities:

- adequate knowledge in the fields of agricultural and forestry sciences and related subjects; other background can be considered based on individual application
- essential skills in the context of ecological, forestry, economic and technical areas, aimed at the sustainable management of natural resources and production processes as well as to the land protection
- existing skill in investigating research techniques as well as the ability to apply research findings to real problems in the forestry and environmental sector.

Direct access is granted to applicants with an Italian degree belonging to the Degree Class 20 DM 509/99 and Degree Class L- 25 DM 270/04 and to the Degree Class 27 DM 509/99 and Degree Class L- 32 DM 270/04.

They also required a minimum graduation grade equal to 90/110 and the knowledge of the English language at the B2 level on the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR).

If the student holds an Italian degree that requires curricular supplements, to enrol in the MSc degree program in Forest Science he/she must have earned at least 50 credits, according to the following table of minimum number of credits per subject area:

If the student does not hold the curricular requirements (title or satisfaction with direct access to the minimum number of credits) admission to the MSc degree program is subjected to a preliminary assessment by the Didactic Commission that verifies the possession of the knowledge and skills required as a condition of access through an on line interview. In the evaluation, the Didactic Commission will take account of the skills acquired in the subject areas similar to the ones in the table above.

International scholars

A successful applicant must hold a bachelor's degree or equivalent qualification that guarantees:

- adequate knowledge in the fields of agricultural and forestry sciences and related subjects; other background can be considered based on individual application
- essential skills in the context of ecological, forestry, economic and technical areas, aimed at the sustainable management of natural resources and production processes as well as to the land protection
- existing skill in investigating research techniques as well as the ability to apply research findings to real problems in the forestry and environmental sector.

A degree classification over 50% on a percent scale or equivalent grade is also required and the applicant whose first language is not English must provide of a minimum knowledge of English such as level B2 according to Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) or equivalent.

Admission to the MSc degree program is subjected to a preliminary assessment by the Didactic Commission that verifies the possession of the knowledge and skills required as a condition of access through an interview through an on line interview. In the evaluation, the Didactic Commission will take account of the skills acquired in the subject areas similar to the ones in the table above.

Housing

The University of Padova, through the Regional Agency for the Right to Education - ESU, provides accommodation in its halls of residence located close to the city center. One hall of residence is also available in Legnaro.

In Legnaro rooms are available in private apartments. The average cost is about € 150-200/month for a place in a double room and about € 180-240/month for a place in a single room, plus extras (telephone, electricity, heating, gas).
